Contract With The Voters

So this contract is about us, for us - and something I want you to hold me accountable for! If I don't live up to it - fire me, or call me home.

As your U.S. senator, I will always remember that I work for you - the people. This is my pledge to you:

1) I will follow the Constitution as my guide in all I do and in every vote I cast.

2) I will champion the message of liberty, prosperity, and certainty to grow our economy, protect our culture, and defend our homeland.

3) I will live in the state, not Washington, D.C.

4) Too many crooked deals happen behind closed doors in Washington. I will maintain an open office - accessible to voters over lobbyists.

5) Each year, I'll visit every county.

6) I will not become a career politician, limiting myself to two terms.

7) I'll provide a weekly update on how I'm serving you and fighting for our values. I will give you the unvarnished truth about what really goes on in the Capitol - the good, the bad, and the ugly. We deserve honesty and accountability from our elected officials.

8) I will not spend more than 80 percent of the budget for my congressional office. I know it's your money -- not mine -- and I know the economy is not booming like it should be. So, I'll make sure to save taxpayer money everywhere I can.

9) I won't forget where I came from, and I'll make sure other senators know who Louisianans really are.

10) I will live by the laws Congress passes for others. Congress should not exempt themselves from the requirements they impose on the people.

11) I will be an independent conservative voice for America first. I will not be beholden to any party machine, party leader, or special interests.

12) I'll never ask you to put your faith in me. Faith should be reserved for the Almighty, not politicians. I will ask for your prayers, and together we can restore the principles of our Republic and get it back working for us.

Freedom For Veterans Plan

President Abraham Lincoln summarized our nation's commitment to our veterans: "To care for him who shall have borne the battle and for his widow and his orphan." A proper role of the federal government is fulfilling the promises made to our service men and service women - those who have defended us from enemies, foreign and domestic. However, it is abundantly clear that today's massive, out-of-touch Department of Veterans Affairs cannot successfully provide appropriate care to those who have risked everything for our freedoms.

The Department of Veterans Affairs was created to ensure that veterans receive the care and support they earned through their service, but it has become an impediment that keeps veterans from their earned care and support. In light of recent revelations that veterans have been woefully neglected while executives awarded themselves bonuses, Congress needs to consider new ideas for the delivery of care to our veterans. It's time to re-commit to our veterans and give them the freedom to make decisions for themselves - after fighting so hard for our right to do the same.

1. Dismantle VA Bureaucracy - Eric Shinseki shouldn't be replaced; he should be the last Secretary of Veterans Affairs. The VA's annual budget is a staggering \$152 billion for a bloated bureaucracy and oftenduplicative infrastructure. Eliminate the VA bureaucracy and move administrative roles to the Department of Defense, making veterans freer to access the care they've earned.

2. Abolish VA Medical System - Approximately one-third of the Department of Veterans Affairs' budget is spent on the Veterans Health Administration Department. Our veterans get trapped in bureaucratic, inefficient, top-down, government-run system with government-paid doctors, nurses and staff. Instead, let's eliminate all spending on duplicative infrastructure, overhead, and personnel. Put veterans and their family members in control of the resources they need to receive quality care.

3. Secure Benefits - Enact legislation to protect access to the care earned by our veterans for themselves and for their families. Make disability and benefits decisions at discharge and immediately issue a simple medical identification card that can be presented to a wide range of care providers.

4. Keep it Competitive - Introduce and promote grants to incentivize private sector companies which specialize in medical care especially important to veterans - like prosthetics, physical therapy, traumatic brain injury (TBI), and post traumatic stress (PST) care - to continually innovate and develop new therapies and treatments that will serve our veterans after they are discharged or retire.

5. Reduce Suicides - We must embrace our veterans with open arms. Every day, 22 veterans commit suicide. There is no better reminder that their fight continues off the battlefield. The military should adopt innovative active duty programs such as the proposed US Special Ops Command PTS program to facilitate the seamless transition of vets into civilian life with continued access to similar transitional programs to help veterans and their families cope with returning to life at home.

6. Housing - The US Department of Housing estimated there are approximately 57,000 homeless veterans on any given night. The FY 2015 VA budget calls for \$1.2 billion dollars to be spent "combating" this epidemic - nearly \$22,000 per vet or double the estimated average cost of rental housing in the US. Get this money directly into the hands of those who need it most and eliminate the wasteful bureaucracy that allows so many vets to sleep on the streets each night despite a 10-figure budget.

7. In short, Keep our Commitment - Always - Keeping our commitment to our veterans means ensuring that they have access to the best care possible without delays or impediments. This can be done without any new costs to our veterans.

Promoting Pro-Life Values to Protect Life Across our Country

"As the debate for and against life unfolds, I can't help but think of my youngest grandson who was born a few years ago, weighing only 2 lbs 5 oz at 28 weeks. After his birth, I spent time with him in the neonatal intensive care unit. Thanks to the medical professionals and - I believe - our prayers, Kellan grew stronger every day until he was finally able to go home with his family. Kellan, had the right to life as soon as he was conceived, and no government or law should deprive him of that right." - Col. Rob Maness, (USAF, ret.)

Promote the Beauty of Life – Crisis pregnancy centers, adoption services, and education can all have significant roles in affirming the dignity and value of human life. Resources now directed to Planned Parenthood should be re-allocated to life-affirming causes and organizations.

Protect the Consciences of Taxpayers – No taxpayer money should be used to fund any procedure or drugs used to end the life of an unborn child. And, no organization that promotes these procedures or drugs should be funded, especially Planned Parenthood.

Stop Infringing on Religious Liberty – I will co-sponsor Sen. Fischer's Health Care Conscience Rights Act which will protect the rights of consumers and companies to offer insurance products and medical care that do not infringe on their religious liberties or moral consciences.

Confirm Pro-Life Judges – I will work to ensure that all judges and justices confirmed to the federal bench are strict constructionists who will not use the Constitution to create or justify laws that were never intended to exist.

Protect All Pain-Capable Babies - I support life from conception on, but it is especially heartbreaking that we cannot all agree that terminating an unborn pain-capable child should not be allowed. I will support and advocate for Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection legislation, which would prohibit any procedure that would end the life of a child over 15 weeks old, except where the mother's life is endangered by continuing the pregnancy.

Oppose Discrimination on Life - I will work to ban abortions on the basis of gender, race, or physical or mental characteristics.

End Child Exploitation – I will sponsor a bill to prevent the exploitation of children by precluding the transport of minors across state lines to secretly terminate pregnancies that their parents are not even aware of or by allowing any person or organization to perform a surgical or chemical abortion on a girl without the consent of a parent or guardian not present.

Without this foundation, every other means [...] must fail." For years American education did both: promoted a happy and virtuous people and equipped young people for the jobs and industries that made our country great.

Us over Washington:

Strip power from the federal government and return it to states and parents. Common Core is the most recent federal power grab in education. It violates states' powers and individual rights, and I oppose it.

Dismantle the Department of Education and redirect the funding now spent on the bloated federal bureaucracy to the states in the form of block grants. I will continue to stand against the federal government's attempts to impose a one-size-fits-all approach on today's students.

Reform Head Start:

I will introduce legislation like the Head Start Improvement Act to empower local governments and parents with the flexibility needed to improve the Head Start Program so that we can achieve the goal of better education for all.

Special Needs Education:

As the parent of a special needs child, I know very well the challenges special needs children will face in the future. Dismantling the Department of Education and redirecting resources now spent on the federal bureaucracy will free resources for states and parents to care for kids with special needs.

Focus on American History:

America is the greatest nation on the face of the earth, but many in today's generation have not been taught about the sacrifices prior generations made to keep us free.

As the federal government rapidly unwinds its involvement in children's education by the dismantling of the Department of Education and by empowering states through block grants, let's set one - and only one - requirement on the recipients: that children learn civics and American history the way we did.

Support Home Schoolers:

Thousands of students are now home schooled. Until there is a tax code overhaul that creates a drastically flatter and fairer system, we should give parents who home school the same tax relief as parents who pay for private schools.

I will introduce legislation to ease the financial burden of home schooling that comes from the current tax code. My legislation will lessen the challenge parents face paying for public schools in addition to their children's educations.

Expanding Opportunities:

Support the Conservative Reform Agenda to improve the ability of students to pursue higher education that fits their goals. Allowing states to have their own accreditation systems will increase competition for education dollars, decrease costs, and create an environment that encourages the creation of new and innovative educational institutions, curriculums, apprenticeship programs, and individualized courses.

Student Loans:

Economic growth and new job opportunities are the best way to lessen the burden of student loans. I've introduced the "Working for Us" Plan to do just that.

The Conservative Reform Agenda (see "Expanding Opportunities") will increase opportunities for students who have fewer resources to invest in education or who want to enter industries that require less expensive two-year degrees.

"Energy for Us" Plan: Securing America's Energy Independence

For far too long, America has relied on foreign nations for our energy, undercutting our energy security. A 21st Century superpower should be in control of its own energy future. Louisiana can and should lead America to Energy Independence. Every day, the situation in the Middle East grows more volatile and unstable with no end in sight. A revitalized, expanding energy sector here in Louisiana will help America rely more on our energy resources and less on resources of war-torn countries. President Obama has used executive orders and agencies in his Administration to shut doors to economic prosperity for Louisiana. We need someone who will fight for us 100% of the time, not side with President Obama 97% of the time.

Make the Keystone XL Pipeline Happen

I will make approving the Keystone XL Pipeline a top priority as your U.S. Senator because I recognize the number of jobs it will create and the critical effects energy independence will have in our state and country.

Liberate America's Energy Resources

America is blessed with an abundance of God-given natural resources and natural beauty. We can have a robust economy and maintain our beautiful state at the same time through the free market and conservation.

• Promote sensible regulations and hold companies accountable for actions that negatively impact our state, whether it is intentional or unintentional.

Move the Department of Energy to An Energy Producing State

Maybe some of our fresh air will help expand the thinking of the political class who has stifled the growth of the American energy sector and made us hostages to foreign interests. The jobs that could be created by an all-of-the-above policy would lead to explosive growth for our economy.

- Move the Department of Energy out of Washington D.C. and put in Energy Producing America.
- Improve revenue sharing with states

Disaster Relief - No Pork, No Delay

"Disaster relief is a real need that should be available the instant a disaster strikes," said Maness. "As your Senator, I will introduce legislation banning special interest pork spending from being put into disaster recovery bills. Localized disasters should not be used as a trough for spending that has nothing to do with disaster relief."

Maness's Disaster Relief - No Pork, No Delay proposal would:

- Develop a pre-funded disaster relief fund to allow money to flow to victims of natural disasters
- Eliminate the opportunity to add in unrelated pork barrel spending
- Provide transparency and accountability in spending

During the Republican Leadership Conference (RLC) earlier this summer, Maness spoke-out about the need for disaster relief without the pork:

"As a Christian nation we know that when natural disaster strikes, we must help our neighbors in need. "But if anyone has the world's goods, and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him?" - 1 John 3:17

"I will fight for disaster relief funds for our state, but I will not go along with the Washington elites to use disaster relief to insert abusive pork-barrel spending. In the Hurricane Katrina relief bill, \$50 million was spent on an indoor rainforest in Iowa. \$50 million of our tax dollars. \$18,000 went for a smoking booth at a private airport in Teterboro, New Jersey. In 2005, the tsunami relief bill for Indonesia included \$25 million for a fish hatchery in Montana, and the Hurricane Sandy relief bill in New Jersey included \$150 million for fisheries in Alaska.

"Probably all great ideas, but not the right place to fund them. No more of that. I'll introduce legislation to end this practice, and I'll make famous the name of any politician who tries to abuse the system again and prevent our citizens from getting the disaster relief aid immediately."

"Doctrine for Keeping America Safe"

- Say what you mean and mean what you say: Don't draw "red lines" unless you can make good on them. Empty words only undermine our credibility and signal weakness to our enemies.
- Never underestimate the enemies of freedom: "JV team." They have grown to represent what the Secretary
 of Defense calls an "imminent threat" to the United States. We cannot afford to underestimate our enemies or
 their resolve to perpetrate violence and harm on free societies.
- Military action may be the last resort, but as President Reagan famously said, "don't mistake or reluctance for war for a lack of resolve." Enemies of the United States cannot and should not be permitted to murder our citizens. Their evil must be met with our strength, and our strength should be mobilized when our national interests are at stake.
- Always have a plan and an exit strategy: Anytime the possibility of using U.S. military force is in play, there has to be a clear strategy and plan that details both the objective and defines success. Trust in the people begins with telling them the truth about what the real situation is, what threats we are facing, what actions we are considering and what risks lie ahead. It also means having a defined exit strategy so the mistakes made by President Obama in Iraq and Afghanistan that paved the way for today's current crisis with ISIS are not repeated again.
- Engage Congress: The use of force and risk of American lives must have the full support of Congress. The case to do so should be presented to Congress for approval, in a transparent way that provides policymakers and the American people with a plan of action. No rogue action by the president.
- Be careful who we arm: Sometimes the best of intentions results in the worst of outcomes. New reports have surfaced that "significant quantities" of U.S.-manufactured small arms have landed in the hands of Islamic State militants. The intention of the United States was to help Syrian rebels; the result has been arming the enemy. If we cannot guarantee that our resources will end up in the right hands, we shouldn't deploy them.
- Honor our fallen heroes, our military veterans and their families: The inefficacy of Washington and misplaced priorities of career politicians should never affect the commitment and debt we owe to those who have sacrificed to protect our freedoms. Permanently lock in benefits, look at modern solutions to healthcare through my "Freedom for Veterans" Plan, and peel back the bureaucratic obstacles so many of our veterans face.
- Enemies of the United States Cannot Return to the State: Any American citizen who goes to Iraq and Syria to fight alongside terrorists like ISIS, should never be allowed to return to the United States as a citizen. It should be treated as a renunciation of their citizenship and they should be treated as an enemy of the United States of America.
